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## Recent HPR Updates

- What better way to finish a chilly race than listen to live music around a bonfire? This year's RF Events [Bonfyre Trail Fest](#) at the DTE Energy Foundation Trails in Chelsea welcomed a dose of warmth to a chilly fall day. While over 700 runners took on 5(ish), 10(ish) and 18(ish) miles, the green team went straight to work, **boasting a waste diversion rate of 99.4%.** That's almost better than a S'more! - [Epic Races](#) closed out their 2025 race season with a snowy dose of fun at the Original A2 Turkey Trot! Runners braved the cold for a 5K, 10K, or Iron Turkey (both races back-to-back) and warmed up afterward with a well-deserved hot breakfast. The Green team fought to keep their hands warm during this event, but despite the cold, they stayed fired up. ## This Issue's FAQ

- **Q: What does HPR recycle?**
  - A: HPR recycles more than just the standard "single stream" materials like cardboard, paper, and plastic. We invest in [TerraCycle](#) Zero Waste Boxes which allow us to recycle specialty items like snack bags, small plastics like bottle caps and zip ties, Gu wrappers (!), hand warmers, and even race bibs and other sports equipment. We also collect and recycle

plastic bags and Styrofoam. If it can possibly be recycled, HPR takes care of it!

## The Latest in Sustainability News

- **France Sets the Trend of Reducing Fast Fashion:** With Black Friday sales already underway, fast-fashion purchases are about to soar, [polluting the environment in many ways when they are discarded](#). Across the Atlantic in France, where it's estimated [35 pieces of clothing are thrown away every second](#), legislators have taken steps to regulate fast fashion companies. The French Senate [approved a bill introducing penalties for fast fashion brands](#), requiring an environmental

impact transparency statement, and even banning fast-fashion advertising. The bill still needs to be passed by Parliament before it becomes law. To learn more about France's efforts to address fast fashion, click this [link](#).

- **State of Michigan Strengthens Environmental Regulations on Large-Scale Farms:** Michigan's environmental regulatory agency is enforcing state rules that require factory farmers to dispose of manure in a sustainable manner. Massive runoff of fertilizers, pesticides, and manure [wreak havoc on the ecosystems of Michigan waterways, Lake Erie's especially](#). ## Zero Waste Fun Fact: Thanksgiving Waste


- It's almost Thanksgiving! Did you know Americans throw out over 320 million pounds of food on Thanksgiving Day? This waste produces over 800,000 metric tons of CO2 equivalent and wastes 39 billion gallons of water. Instead of throwing food away, consider making less, freezing leftovers, and reusing leftovers to make new meals.
- Compost what you can't reuse in a backyard pile or at a commercial facility. Ann Arbor has a curbside collection for compostables, and [Scio Township just started a public dropoff for food waste](#). Turn it back into productive dirt instead of methane-producing landfill!
